Parents can help their child communicate by providing choices! When children have a choice, it helps build cooperation skills, encourages independence, prevents power struggles, and gives your child a sense of control.

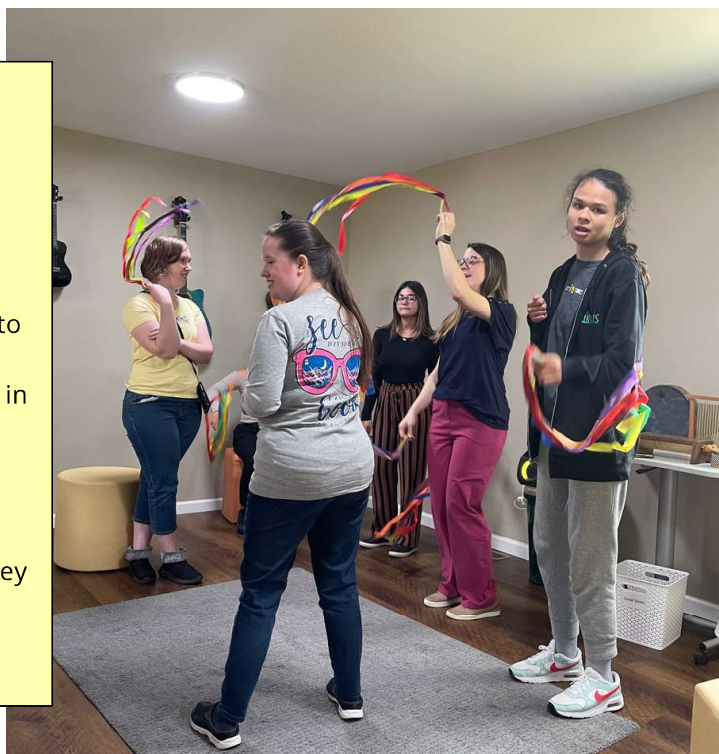
Example: "Do you want the blocks or the puzzle?"
